Joining Southbank Centre's Access Scheme may entitle you to concessionary ticket prices or to bring a companion with you, for free, to certain events.

By letting us know your access requirements we will, where possible, seat you appropriately.

- Southbank Centre has step-free access to auditoria and performance spaces, meeting rooms, cafes, restaurants and bars.
- There is an infrared hearing enhancement system in all auditoria and a portable hearing enhancement system that can be used in other spaces.
- We arrange speech-to-text reporting, captioning and audio description for a wide range of events.
- The monthly diary is available in alternative formats (large print, MP3, Braille).

PARKING

Accessible car parking is provided in the Hayward Gallery Car Park and is free for Blue Badge holders attending ticketed Southbank Centre events. To exchange your parking ticket for a free exit pass, please take your event and parking tickets to any Southbank Centre Ticket Office. Please note the number of spaces is limited.
